UNIVERSIADES ARE WORLD UNIVERSITY GAMES

organized biennially by the International University Sports Federation (FISU) as multisport events for participants between the ages of 17 and 28, who are current university students or who graduated in the year preceding the Games. Such »Student Olympics« are natural meeting points for young people who will shape the world of tomorrow. The Games are genuinely universal, because they bring together student athletes not only from FISU member countries but from all over the world, wherever the Olympic movement holds ground or university sports associations exist.

Universiades are not only outstanding sports meets; they promote international cultural exchange and spread mutual understanding, friendship and peace throughout the world. The International Student Games have been played since 1923, but as »Universiades« they began in 1959 and have been held regularly ever since:

THE HOST OF UNIVERSIADE '87 IS ZAGREB

– the second largest city of Yugoslavia and capital of Croatia, one of the six constituent Republics and two Autonomous Provinces which together make up the Yugoslav federation.

The FISU Executive Committee's decision to entrust Yugoslavia with the organization of the 14th World University Games came as a recognition of this country's rich experience as host of important international sports events – over 90 World and European championships, including all sports from the Universiade programme. The highlights of this outstanding record were the 8th Mediterranean Games (Split, 1979) and the 14th Winter Olympic Games (Sarajevo, 1984).
